

Dear Church Family,

Paul writes to the church in Ephesus:

"Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen." -Ephesians 3:20-21

God says, "Come to me with positive expectations, knowing there is no limit to what I can accomplish." Karen and I know this to be true. Every step of our ministry journey has been accomplished by one positive expectation after another. Time is a trainer, teaching us to wait with patience and trust for the next step of the journey God has planned for us. God says, "Come to me with a teachable spirit, eager to be changed."

The Old Testament book of Proverbs, Solomon shares, "In his heart a man plans his journey, but the Lord determines his steps (16:9)." Sometimes the pace of our steps comes slowly. Other times the pace of our steps become a dead run. A close walk with God is a life of continual newness and change. We should not cling to the old ways as we step into this New Year! As we focus our thoughts on God, please know that God is fully attentive on each of us. God sees us with a steady eye because his attention span is infinite.

To the church in Rome, Paul writes,

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect (12:2)."

Karen and I have given ourselves over to this adventure! We keep increasing our attentiveness to God's presence. This simple practice helps us to see God in every situation, and also his control over the entire universe including our little part in it. When you see it this way, fear loses its grip and adverse circumstances become opportunities for growth. Because God is our constant companion, there is a lightness in our step that is noticeable to those around us.

In the Old Testament book of Jeremiah, God states,

"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give a future with hope (29:11)."

If you do not already know this, Karen and I are active planners. We are always working out what needs to be accomplished six months to a year out. I confess that I had my four years of college mapped out on what courses to take and when to take them. I was a full-time student along with both of us working full-time along with being active in church and civic groups. We were raising three children with a house mortgage and car payment just to make things interesting.

I also confess that one of my biggest struggles is with procrastinators and those who do not do their due diligence where important tasks are concerned. After almost 30 years in ministry, I have learned to read people well, especially where the church is concerned. I have a Bible verse that gives me hope and inspiration when I feel as dismal as a grey day in winter.

This verse is Psalm 73:23-24:

Yet I am always with you; you hold me by my right hand. You guide me with your counsel, and afterward you take me into glory.
