Dear Church Family,

This is your August & September newsletter due to the convalescent time after Karen's rotator cuff surgery. And for whatever reason, this has caused me to recite the above nursery rhyme as a mantra and in this way: "Thirty days has September, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John." I don't know why this mantra is but that is just how it is!

Thirty Days Has September also sometimes known as "The Days of the Month" is a rhyme and mnemonic used to remember how many days there are in a certain month. The origin of this rhyme dates back to the 16th century when it first appeared in written form in 1577 when William Harrison, the priest, referred to it as "Thirty dayes hath Nouember".

A mnemonic is a device such as a pattern of letters, ideas, or associations that assists in remembering something, for example ROY G. BIV stands for the colors of the rainbow: Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Indigo, and Violet. An example of a spelling mnemonic for the word friend: Fred Rushed in Eating Nine Doughnuts.

I have a good friend, who calls me to check-in and to checkup. He always has a joke to tell me each time. Last month he called and asked, "What did the zero say to the number eight?" To which I said, "Don't know." His punchline was, "Nice belt!" He had called to remind us that his wedding anniversary was fast approaching, a wedding I officiated in their front yard in July of 2013.

This good friend lives a high stress and pressure vocation that could easily devour him heart, body and soul. Don't get me wrong, his high stress and pressure vocation is also the passion in his life. This good friend has developed his own version of a mnemonic device for his own good mental and spiritual health. He says this mnemonic device has paid big dividends in his perspective on life and in his vocation. So, there is truth in what Proverbs 15:13 says, "A happy heart makes the face cheerful, but heartache crushes the spirit."

My good friend's mnemonic device was memorizing 21 Bible verses that are both specific and important to him. He will recite all 21 Bible verses both at the beginning and the end of his day. This is his mnemonic prayer life, remembering with gratitude and in humility, the God who gives him ALL, even his passion for that high stress and pressure vocation. His mnemonic device allows him the ability to center himself in God while giving him distance from the dangers in his life that come from the evil one.

Great minds think alike because I use a similar biblical mnemonic prayer device in my life. Reciting specific and important to me brings God into my life to walk along beside me. This settles me in the stress and pressure of what I do in my vocation. I am able to step away from the troubles and anger in this world into the peace and serenity of God's higher plane.

Here is the second joke my good friend told me. "Why did the whale blush when he saw the ocean? Because he saw the ocean's bottom!"

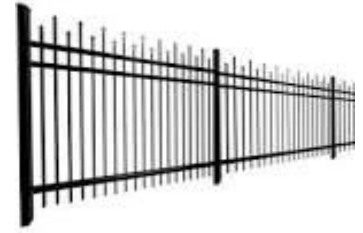
No further business, meeting adjourned.

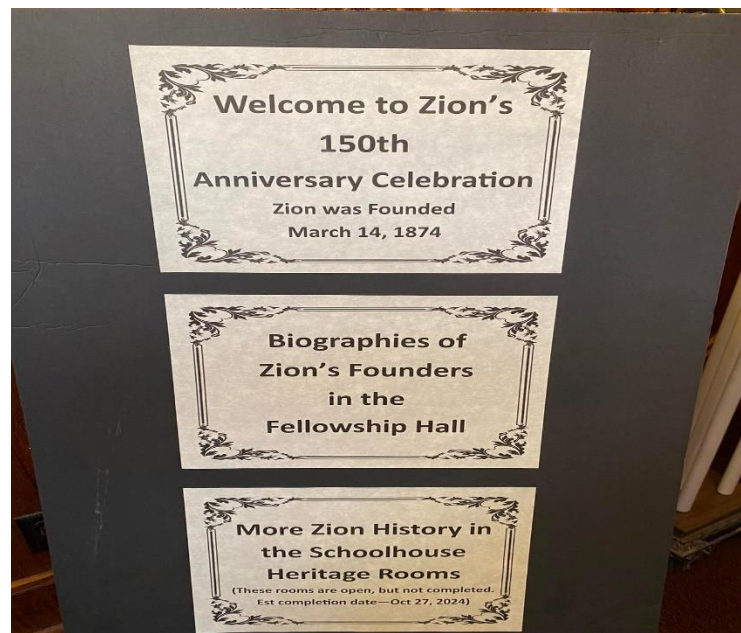


Youth - 2024 Youth Trip to Colorado
