Dear Church Family,

October 27, 2024 is Reformation Sunday at Zion Lutheran Church is all about remembering our Lutheran roots. Those Lutheran roots were uprooted from Germany and replanted in southeast Nebraska because the immigrants understood the need for church being central in their lives in this new country, they now called home. Martin Luther's teachings brought them a sense of security and continuity in an ever-changing world.

### We walk by faith and not by sight. 2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians 5:7

October 27<sup>th</sup> is also the third Sunday we will celebrate our sesquicentennial anniversary. Rev. Casey Lieneman, son of this church family, will be our guest pastor on this 150<sup>th</sup> year celebration. Pastor Casey presently serves Redeemer Lutheran Church in Hooper, NE. This Sunday will be a day of celebration, celebrating both a 150 years of Zion's ministry existence and all the sons of this church who became pastors.

# *Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails.* Proverbs 19:21

I find it interesting that in the150 years Zion called eighteen pastors (not counting interim pastors) to serve them. Now if you divide 150 years by 18 pastors you come up with eight years and four months per pastor, but that's not the truth or factual.

- **Rev. J.B. Reents** served for 43 years (1902-1945) making his ministry the longest and most impactful on Zion including the sanctuary we worship in today.
- **Rev. Bill Jurgens** served 20 years (1974-1994) making him second only to Rev, Reents guiding this church family through the aftermath of the Vietnam War and farm crisis of the 1980's.
- Until I came to serve Zion, Rev. John Hieronymus served Zion for ten years (1946-1956) making him third longest pastor to serve Zion. Rev. Hieronymus may have been just as impactful as Rev. Reents because he led Zion's transition in worship from German to English (which was no easy accomplishment) after World War II.

Notice how God provides the right pastor at the right time! God is and was, always involved in each moment of this church's 150 years. God carefully mapped out every inch of this journey even though much of it felt haphazard. Because the world is in a fallen condition things always seem to be unraveling around the edges. If we look for trouble we will find trouble. Jesus said,

### "Do not judge and you will not be judged. Do not condemn and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven," Luke 6:37

This church's hope and future are rooted in heaven. Nothing can rob you of this inheritance. God in Christ came to set all people free. As the Holy Spirit controls both mind and actions, we become free indeed.

## **Cemetery Update**

Work is continuing at the cemetery on the fence project, headstone base replacement, headstone straightening, and dirt work on the next section to the north.

Several weeks ago, Gary Carstens brought a track hoe and motor grader to start the leveling project on the new north section. Scott Carstens and AJ Wiese brought their side dump trailers to haul the dirt from a pond Wade Thornburg had dug out. Approximately 60-80 loads of dirt were hauled and leveled in the section.

Gary, Wade, AJ, Scott donated their time and equipment to work. Please give them a big thank you for their service and contribution to Zion Cemetery.

Materials for the fence are slowly arriving at the welding shop. Todd Wilcox is building the sections and will install them after they have been powder coated.

We have \$51,932.00 of the \$54,000.00 needed for phase one which is the east and south side of the cemetery. We will be receiving some dollars from the Gage County Big Give. The second phase of the project will be on the west side of the cemetery. This phase will run approximately \$67,000.00. Donations are always appreciated.

Ben Walters has installed bases or straightened 50 headstones. The three sections to the south have been completed. We have allocated \$5000.00 Towards this project and have moved to the next section to the north. The cost of this work runs anywhere from \$50.00 to \$1500.00 depending on the work to be done and the size of the headstone. If you have a family member in the cemetery whose stone needs work, please let us know so we can include it in the phase or add it to the next time money is allocated. If you would like to contribute to repairing your family's headstones, it would be appreciated, and we would have Ben include it.
