Prelude - Bell

St. Paul's poetic chapter on the depth and breadth of love stands at the center of this season's readings and provides a keystone to hold the remainder of Epiphany and texts in place. While the second reading throughout the season of Epiphany provides a sweeping time overview of Paul's wisdom and counsel to the troubled church at Corinth, the gospel texts give us a glimpse into the early ministry of Jesus through Luke's theological lens.

Children's Time: Being Useful in God's Kingdom

The people who came to John to be baptized wanted to be useful in God's kingdom and not a pile of useless chaff.

Readings

Isaiah 43:1-7

Lector – Near the end of Israel's exile in Babylon, God promises to bring the people home. They need no longer be afraid, because the one who formed, created, and called them by name now redeems them from all their enemies. God declares them precious and honored, and God loves them.

For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest. until her vindication shines out like the dawn, and her salvation like a burning torch. The nations shall see your vindication, and all the kings your glory; and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will give. You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God. You shall no more be termed Forsaken. and your land shall no more be termed Desolate; but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the Lord delights in you, and your land shall be married. For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your builder marry you,

so shall your God rejoice over you. Here ends this reading.

Psalm 29 - Read responsively. Ascribe to the Lord, O heavenly beings, ascribe to the Lord glory and strength. Ascribe to the Lord the glory of his name; worship the Lord in holy splendor. The voice of the Lord is over the waters; the God of glory thunders, the Lord, over mighty waters.

and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride,

The voice of the Lord is powerful;

the voice of the Lord is full of majesty.

The voice of the Lord breaks the cedars; the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon.

He makes Lebanon skip like a calf, and Sirion like a young wild ox.

The voice of the Lord flashes forth flames of fire.

The voice of the Lord shakes the wilderness;

the Lord shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.

The voice of the Lord causes the oaks to whirl, and strips the forest bare; and in his temple all say, "Glory!"

The Lord sits enthroned over the flood; the Lord sits enthroned as king forever.

May the Lord bless his people with peace!

Acts 8:14-17

Lector – Peter and John are sent to support the new Christians in Samaria, a group that was recently baptized after hearing the good news of Christ through the preaching of Philip. Here the Samaritans receive the gift of the Holy Spirit in the laying on the hands.

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then

Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit. Here ends this reading.

Prayer of the Day

As you are able, please stand.

P- Almighty God,

C- you anointed Jesus at his baptism with the Holy Spirit and revealed him as your Son. Keep all who are born of the water and Spirit faithful in your service, that we may rejoice to be called children of God, through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever, amen.

Gospel - Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

P- The reading opens with questions about the identity of the Messiah. John the Baptist insists he is not the Messiah; instead he points ahead to one who is coming. And whether the voice of God was heard by all or only by Jesus, God settles the matter: Jesus is God's beloved Son.

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." The Gospel of the Lord.

Jesus came to serve and not be served. Hoe interesting that on the eve of the crucifixion, Jesus, not the disciples, will demonstrate servanthood by washing the disciples' feet—*Jesus* will be the one untying their sandals.
